Online Learning - Reasons for Withdrawals

- Family commitments / social obligations / time management
- Dual enrolled student misconceptions
- Financial challenges
- Grades / academic struggles
- Technological constraints
- Lack of classroom rapport and connection to the college community

Online Readiness Adoption




2017




How Students Are Identified

 - Must complete the Online Success Seminar (OSS) before continuing to take fully online (80-100%) courses.












Fast Facts



- In 2023/24, 81.2% of DSC students took at least one distance education course.
- Closed gaps between face-to-face (F2F) and distance education courses:

Mode of Instruction	2023-2024	2022-2023	2021-2022
Online	81.8% ^	79.6%	79.8%
Hybrid	84.7% ^	81.7%	80.2%
Lecture	83.6%	83.1%	83.8%





Success & Persistence rates show notable differences between students who did complete OSS, and those who did not complete the OSS.

Success Rates	FA23	SP24
Completed OSS	51%	46%
Did not complete OSS	27%	35%
Difference (%)	<mark>+ 24%</mark>	<mark>+ 11%</mark>

Persistence Rates	FA23 to SP24	
Completed OSS	65%	
Did not complete OSS	49%	
Difference (%)	<mark>+ 16%</mark>
