- Over-Involvement of Parents
- Fear of Making Mistakes
- Cultural Expectations
- Navigating Complex Systems Alone



### **Strategies to Empower Students:**

- Encourage Self-Advocacy
- Promote Student-Led Decision-Making
- Set Achievable Goals
- Provide Resources, Not Answers
- Integrate Academic Coaching Techniques

### Understanding Helicopter Parenting

 A parent who takes an "overprotective or excessive interest in the life of their child or children" (Swalboski, 2018 as cited in Truschel & Hoffman, 2021).

- **A** Allow autonomy
- **R** Reinforce confidence
- **E** Empathy
- N Nurture communication
- **T** Transparency

- Set clear expectations

  - Academic tools
  - Mentorship programs
